

# Information for Authors

The Journal of Insect Biotechnology and Sericology publishes **Regular Articles**, **Technical Reports** and **Short Communications** on all aspects of original research concerned with the studies of sericultural science and insect technology. The journal is particularly dedicated to the publication of contributions of a basic and fundamental nature, although it will accept suitable articles pertaining to the applications of sericultural science and insect technology. **Reviews** will usually be invited by the Editorial Board. Prospective writers of reviews should first consult the Editor-in-Chief.

Articles will be published in English. When submitting the manuscript, authors who feel their English language manuscript may require editing to eliminate possible grammatical or spelling errors and to conform to correct scientific English may wish to use the English Language Editing.

## Manuscripts should be submitted to:

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- Microsoft Word for text
- PowerPoint (suitable for diagrams and/or images) for figures
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## Manuscript Preparation

- 1. Manuscript should be typed doble-spaced on 8 1/2"x11" (DIN A4) paper with a standard margin, within 80 words per line and 22 lines per page, with serial line numbers through the whole document.
- 2. Authors must write the tile, author(s)'s name(s), and affiliation, running tile (not exceeding 45 letters and spaces in length), and correspondence information on the first page of the manuscript. The text must start from the second page.
- 3. The manuscript generally should be composed in the following order: ABSTRACT, Key words, INTRODUCTION, MATERIALS AND METHODS, RESULTS, DISCUSSION, ACKNOWLEDGMENTS, and REFERENCES, followed by Figure legends and Table titles. Chapter titles should be written in bold letters, subsequent paragraph titles in bold and italics. There is no need to put level numbers. References should be cited in the text by the names of authors and years of publication. Papers written by 3 or more authors should appear with the first author's name followed by "et al.".
  - 1) The length of abstract must be 250 words or less. No abstracts required for Short Communications.
  - 2) Four to six key words or phrases should be indicated after the abstract. The key words should be arranged alphabetically.
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### **Example:**

Grynkiewicz, G., Poenie, M. and Tsien, R.Y. (1985) A new generation of Ca<sup>2+</sup> indicators with greatly improved fluorescence properties. *J. Biol. Chem.*, **280**, 3440-3450.

References to a book should include authors' name, year of publication, title of book (editor(s) of the article, if any), edition (if other than the first) total pages or page(s) cited, publisher and place of publication.

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Type appearing within figures (axis labels, for example) is in Helvetica or a similar typeface and is of sufficient size and contrast to retain clarity if reduced in size.

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
