

## Information for Authors

The Journal of Insect Biotechnology and Sericology publishes **Regular Articles**, **Technical Reports** and **Short Communications** on all aspects of original research concerned with the studies of sericultural science and insect technology. The journal is particularly dedicated to the publication of contributions of a basic and fundamental nature, although it will accept suitable articles pertaining to the applications of sericultural science and insect technology. **Reviews** will usually be invited by the Editorial Board. Prospective writers of reviews should first consult the Editor-in-Chief.

Articles will be published in English. When submitting the manuscript, authors who feel their English language manuscript may require editing to eliminate possible grammatical or spelling errors and to conform to correct scientific English may wish to use the English Language Editing.

Manuscripts should be submitted preferably by E-mail attachment. Manuscript files should be converted into portable document files (PDF) and sent by E-mail, with a cover letter available from a website. E-Mail address of the Editor-in-Chief is shown above.

After the announcement of acceptance of the article, editable files are required for processing in production. The following file format are acceptable:

- Microsoft Word for text
- PowerPoint (suitable for diagrams and/or images) for figures
- Microsoft Excel for tables

The editable files should be sent to the Editor-in-Chief by E-mail. In the case of sending by mail, the files should be saved in CD-R, DVD-R, or USB flash memory and be sent to the mailing address shown above.

### Manuscript Preparation

1. Manuscript should be typed double-spaced on 8 1/2"x11" (DIN A4) paper with a standard margin, within 80 words per line and 22 lines per page, with serial line numbers through the whole document.
2. Authors must write the title, author(s)'s name(s), and affiliation, running title (not exceeding 45 letters and spaces in length), and correspondence information on the first page of the manuscript. The text must start from the second page.
3. The manuscript generally should be composed in the following order: **ABSTRACT**, **Key words**, **INTRODUCTION**, **MATERIALS AND METHODS**, **RESULTS**, **DISCUSSION**, **ACKNOWLEDGMENTS**, and **REFERENCES**, followed by **Figure legends** and **Table titles**. Chapter titles should be written in bold letters, subsequent paragraph titles in bold and italics. There is no need to put level numbers. References should be cited in the text by the names of authors and years of publication. Papers written by 3 or more authors should appear with the first author's name followed by "*et al.*".
  - 1) The length of abstract must be 250 words or less. No abstracts required for Short Communications.
  - 2) Four to six key words or phrases should be indicated after the abstract. The key words should be arranged alphabetically.
  - 3) How to write **REFERENCES**:  
References should be listed alphabetically at the end of the paper in the following order: Author's name(s), year, title, journal's title, volume, and page numbers. Titles of journals should be abbreviated in accordance with the Biological Abstracts and the Chemical Abstracts. Indicate the volume number in parenthesis if the cited volume does not have the pages numbered consecutively. Only the volume number is in **bold**.

**Example:**

Grynkiwicz, G., Poenie, M. and Tsien, R.Y. (1985) A new generation of Ca<sup>2+</sup> indicators with greatly improved fluorescence properties. *J. Biol. Chem.*, **280**, 3440-3450.

References to a book should include authors' name, year of publication, title of book (editor(s) of the article, if any), edition (if other than the first) total pages or page(s) cited, publisher and place of publication.

**Examples:**

Wagner, R.P. and Mitchell, H.K. (1964) In *Genetics and Metabolism* (2nd ed.), p. 673, John Wiley and Sons, Inc., New York.

Mayer, M.S. and Mankin, R.W. (1985) In *Comprehensive Insect Physiology, Biochemistry and Pharmacology* (Kerkut, G.A. and Gilbert, L.I. eds.), Vol. 9, pp. 95-144, Pergamon Press, Oxford.

- 4) **Tables** should be numbered and cited in the text in sequence using Arabic numerals (i.e. Table 1, Table 2 etc.). Each table must have a descriptive heading and explanatory legend to make the table understandable without reference to the text.
- 5) **Figures** should be numbered consecutively with Arabic numerals in order of appearance in the text (i.e. Fig. 1); each figure should have a descriptive legend.  
Type appearing within figures (axis labels, for example) is in Helvetica or a similar typeface and is of sufficient size and contrast to retain clarity if reduced in size.

**4. Proof**

Authors will receive a set of galley proof, with the original manuscript. After correction, the proof should be returned to the Editor-in-Chief together with the original manuscript. Careful checking is needed even for proofs typeset from electric files since it receives some editorial modifications.

**5. Copyright**

All articles published in the journal are protected by copyright, which covers the exclusive rights to reproduce and distribute the article. No material published in this journal may be reproduced without written permission from the editor.

**6. Charges.**

- 1) 10,000JPY will be charged per manuscript as submission fee when the first author or corresponding author is not a member of The Japanese Society of Sericultural Science.
- 2) Authors are responsible for paying page charges under the flat rate system based on the number of printed pages as follows: 30,000JPY for a less than 4 page-article, and 60,000JPY for a 5 to 10 page-article. Exceeding 10 pages, 4,500JPY per each additional page will be charged.
